Jobs to do in the garden

Have a good walk around you garden and make a list of any alterations that you might like to make and prioritise them.

Order any seeds and bulbs that would like to grow. Most summer flowering bulbs need to be planted in the March. In fact, March can be a very busy month, so we need to be organised, especially if you are having your garden open in June.

Antirrhinums and Lobelia are very slow to germinate and these need to be sown indoors towards the end of January.

In the Vegetable garden. When the ground is workable and starting to warm up, sow your parsnips before anything else as they take around four weeks to germinate.

March is to be taken advantage of as it really is action time in the garden.

The Gardeners Club Committee have their first meeting of the year on Monday 12th January, so we would be grateful of any thoughts and suggestions before then.

The Open Gardens Committee have their first meeting of the year on Wednesday 14th January, so again it would be lovely to hear of your suggestions before then.
